A TASTE OF HISTORY IN BOYNTON AND DELRAY

A new gastronomic history tour hits the road this Saturday in Boynton Beach and Delray Beach, offering a narrated guide to the area's culinary history. Organized by the **Museum of Lifestyle & Fashion History (MLFH)** in Boynton Beach, the three-hour tour takes visitors by bus and by foot to restaurants of historical interest.

The first **Culinary Tour of Historic Boynton Beach and Delray Beach** takes off Saturday at 11 a.m., followed by similar gastronomic tours the third Saturday of each month. Each tour stops at two restaurants for tastings and a chat about food and local history.

Tours begin at MLFH, inside the north wing of the Boynton Beach Mall, 801 N. Congress Ave., Suite 483. Tours cost \$20 per person 18 and older, free for children under age 18 (with a maximum of five kids per family).
